"Scratch is a digital media design program where kids can make video games and videos and do animations. They can add music, photos and different sound effects," Piehl said. Children and adults are invited to learn Scratch -- or display their skills -- at 9 a.m.-noon, Saturday, May 22, at the library.

Ricarose Roque, one of the developers of Scratch at Massachusetts Institute of Technology, will answer questions. "Some of our teen volunteers are really good at Scratch and they'll be there to answer questions and help people get started," Piehl said.

Anyone who has a laptop is encouraged to bring it, but laptops will also be available. There will be a raffle of Scratch T-shirts and refreshments will be served.

Piehl said, "I'm hoping that all the Scratchers from across the Chicago area will stop by that day."
