The Lands Beyond lead to adventure for a bored boy in "The Phantom Tollbooth." They will also spell adventure for audiences when Evanston Children's Theatre stages the play based on Norton Juster's classic children's novel. Performances are 7 p.m. Friday, 3 p.m. and 7 p.m. Saturday and 3 p.m. Sunday, Nov. 12-14, at the Levy Center, 300 Dodge Ave., Evanston.

Artistic director Allie Miller's 53 actors, age 8 through eighth graders (in two separate casts), are going to literally make the pages of the book come alive.

"We went with the idea of it being a storybook, so all of our props are one-dimensional. Most are made of paper and cardboard," Miller said. "Our set-which was quite the undertaking-is a scrolling panorama. Each backdrop is one full sheet of rolled up paper-5 feet tall and 18 feet long." Cast members will advance the scroll for each scene. "It's going to be pretty impressive if all goes well," the director said.

Miller added that adults will also enjoy the show because "it's full of puns and plays on words."
