

## **Lookingglass Theatre Sets 2014-15 Season: DEATH TAX, TITLE AND DEED & More**

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Lookingglass Theatre Company announces its 2014-2015 Season, opening with Lucas Hnath's Death Tax directed by Artistic Director of New Work Heidi Stillman; the return of Lookingglass' hallmark Lookingglass Alice, adapted and directed by Ensemble Member David Catlin in association with The Actors Gymnasium; Will Eno's Title and Deed directed by Lookingglass Literary Manager and Company Dramaturg Marti Lyons; and the World Premiere Lookingglass original adaptation of Herman Melville's Moby

Dick, adapted and directed by Ensemble Member David Catlin in association with The Actors Gymnasium.

Lookingglass also announces the addition of Lindsey Noel Whiting, Kareem Bandealy and Scott Silberstein to the Company's Artistic Associates. Lindsey Noel Whiting will again star in the return of Rick Bayless in Cascabel, beginning July 2014, and her previous Lookingglass credits include The Great Fire, Icarus, and Lookingglass Alice. Kareem Bandealy was most recently seen at Lookingglass in David Catlin's The Little Prince; the world premiere of Keith Huff's Big Lake, Big City, directed by Ensemble Member David Schwimmer; Bengal Tiger at the Baghdad Zoo; and Peter Pan. Longtime Production Affiliate Scott Silberstein of HMS Media has been filming archival and production video for Lookingglass since its 2003 production of Race. He was also the video designer for Lookingglass' acclaimed stage adaptation of George Orwell's 1984, for which he was nominated for a Jeff Award.

"Lookingglass' 2014-2015 Season will offer that rare combination of epic adventure and intimate intensity that is our signature and that our audiences have come to love," comments Artistic Director Andrew White. "With David Catlin's world-premiere adaptation of Moby Dick, we continue Lookingglass' long history of bringing the world's great literature to bold, visceral life with the kind of physical ensemble-theater punch that has become a trademark of both Catlin and Lookingglass. Death Tax and Title and Deed feature two of America's most incisive and insightful playwrights-on-the-rise: Lucas Hnath's Death Tax is a taut and wickedly sharp ensemble piece about the intersection of America's two inevitables, death and taxes; and with Will Eno's gorgeous and lyrical Title & Deed we have the good fortune to bring together the award-winning playwright's electric, fireworks show of language and Chicago's own Michael Patrick Thornton in a one-man tour de force. And after an almost five year absence, Lewis Carroll's Alice will once again journey through the Lookingglass into a world of peril, discovery and wonder in one of the Company's signature pieces, Lookingglass Alice."
