You wouldn't expect to hear a magician talking about outer space and kids literature, but Sean Masterson has a unique way of engaging audiences of all ages.

"A lot of the magic comes in the form of stories," Masterson explained. "There's a little scenario about Mars, black holes and the sun." Another scenario involves a puppet ghost from the past. "He has several books that first graders are familiar with -- James and the Giant Peach, Charlotte's Web and Charlie and the Chocolate Factory," the magician said. "He does magic with those books and a volunteer."

Your family can experience that intriguing blend during Masterson's "Vaudeville Magic Show," 7:30 p.m. Friday, 7 p.m. Saturday and 3 p.m. Sunday, Nov. 6-8, at The Actors Gymnasium, 927 Noyes St., Evanston. "Some of the younger kids get pulled in with the stories," Masterson said. "And then I try to make the magic deceptive enough so that the adults are amazed as well."
