'Lookingglass Alice' to return in November

Lookingglass Theatre Company's 2014-15 season will feature a remounting of "Lookingglass Alice," the company's popular adaptation of the Lewis Carroll story, it was announced Tuesday.

The season starts in September with "Death Tax" by Lucas Hnath, a playwright whose work "Isaac's Eye" will also be performed at Writers Theatre next season. Heidi Stillman directs "Death Tax," which features Deanna Dunagan, J. Nicole Brooks, Raymond Fox and Louise Lamson.

Next, in November, is "Lookingglass Alice." David Catlin directs the production, which has been mounted at Lookingglass

four times previously since its debut in 2005. It is produced in association with The Actors Gymnasium.

Then, beginning in March, is Will Eno's "Title and Deed," a monologue not unlike the playwright's "Thom Pain (based on nothing)," starring Michael Patrick Thornton and directed by Marti Lyons.

And the 2014-15 season ends with a world-premiere adaptation of Herman Melville's "Moby Dick," adapted and directed by Catlin, and produced in association with The Actors Gymnasium.

All performances take place at Lookingglass Theatre Company, 821 N. Michigan Ave.
